SHERIFF'S REPORT: Deputy Widmer was in attendance and presented the Sheriff's report. He reviewed the call types and answered questions from the

Council.

A motion was made to approve the Sheriff's report as presented by Mr. Backes, seconded by Mr. Schmitz. Motion carried unanimously.

BUILDING INSPECTOR'S

REPORT: The 2022 building permit spreadsheet was presented. Nine additional

permits were issued in April including another four new single family

homes.

A motion was made to approve the report as presented by Mr. Schmitz, seconded by Mr. Backes. Motion carried unanimously.

PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE:

Mr. Blashack presented quotes for a new mag meter on our sewer line to the area treatment plant. He explained why he thought it was a good idea to switch to this type of meter. Mr. McCabe indicted the funding could come from remaining ARPA funds.

A motion was made to accept the bid from Flow Measurement and Control in the amount of \$11,983 by Mr. Backes, seconded by Mr. Schmitz. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Kiffmeyer updated the Council on the dust coating and street sweeping. He also stated he met with Stearns County about cleaning their pond and indicated their intent is to be done late May early June.

FIRE DEPT. REPORT:

Assistant Chief Steinhofer presented the March monthly report indicating there were nine calls for the month and 29 for the year total. This compares to 22 at the same time last year. Monthly training was provided by Fire Inc. and was on confined space entry. He stated the new firefighter started last month and an ISO meeting is scheduled next week.

A motion was made to approve the report by Mr. Backes, seconded by Mr. Schmitz. Motion carried unanimously.

OPEN FORUM: no comments offered.

2021 AUDIT PRESENTATION:

Jenna Innes of Smith Schaffer and Associates was in attendance to present the 2021 Audit and Financial Statement. She explained the letters included with the financial statement before going into a power point presentation on the highlights of the financial statement. She answered questions from the Council.

A motion was made to accept the 2021 Audit and approve the 2021 Financial Statement by Mr. Backes, seconded by Mr. Genereux. Motion carried unanimously.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mr. Boots updated the Council on the 2022 Street project indicating it will start next week. He asked for approval of up to a \$15,000 change order for a silt screen on the cattle pass as well as some quantity adjustments for additional asphalt on the corners.

A motion was made to authorize the approval of a change order up to \$15,000 by Mr. Backes, seconded by Mr. Schmitz. Motion carried unanimously.

COUNCIL MEMBER

PURVIEW:

Mr. Backes thanked those in attendance.

Mr. Schmitz inquired about the potential sink hole on 200th Street and was told it was stabilized and appears to be holding.

Mr. Genereux asked about the catch basins and Mr. Boots said he hadn't had a chance yet to look at them.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR

REPORT:

Mr. McCabe presented the multi-family rental licensing ordinance stating the first fire chief was initially in charge of doing the inspections. When he resigned, the enforcement of the ordinance was suspended until a new inspector was trained. Mr. McCabe requested we hire the inspector from the City of St. Joseph Emily Wallen at \$25/hour.

A motion was made to hire Ms. Wallen at \$25/hour to conduct the required biennial inspections by Mr. Backes, seconded by Mr. Genereux. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Couri reported on the letter from Mr. Winkelman. He stated we will file a summary judgement motion with the court and explained the process. He answered the questions from the Council.

A motion was made to adjourn at 7:50pm by Mr. Schmitz, seconded by Mr. Genereux. Motion carried unanimously.

 - 2. Call Percentage (10 points)
 - a) Maintain SAFD minimum call percentage for the most recent three years.
 - 3. Business Meetings & Trainings (10 points)
 - a) Maintain SAFD minimum meeting and training attendance requirements for the most recent three years.
 - 4. Peer Review (20 points)
 - 5. Final Interview (50 points)
 - a) Final Interview panel determined based on rank of open position(s).
 - 6. Veteran's Preference points added (must ask the veteran if he/she wants veteran's preference points added):
 - a) 5% of available points added for disabled honorably discharged veteran.
 - b) 5% of available points added for spouse of disabled honorably discharged veteran.
 - 7. The highest scoring candidate(s) for the open position(s) will be presented to the City Council for approval / appointment

St. Augusta Fire Department Standard Operating and Response Guidelines

Promotional Appointments and Process

Board of Officer Appointments

- A. If and/or when a position(s) opens in the Board of Officers, the Fire Chief may move to fill the open position(s).
- B. The appointment process shall be based off of a points system (100 points maximum) scored as follows:
 - 1. Letter of Intent and Resume (10 points maximum)
 - a) Letter of intent (1 point maximum)
 - b) Resumes (9 points maximum)
 Resumes shall be scored based off of desired qualifications. Each desired qualification shall equal (1 point each). Points possible per each classification: Lieutenant (4 points), Captain (5 points), Assistant Chief (7 points).
 Additional training pertinent to the job shall make up the rest of the available points. Each additional training pertinent to the job shall equal (1 point each). Points possible per each classification: Lieutenant (5 points), Captain (4 points), Assistant Chief (2 points).
 - 2. Call Percentage (10 points maximum)
 - a) Call percentage shall be scored off of a sliding scale.
 30% shall equal (1 point) and 57% and up shall equal (10 points), each 3% increase in between 30% and 57% shall equal another (1 point) earned.
 - 3. Business Meetings (5 points maximum) & Department Trainings (5 points maximum)
 - a) Business Meetings shall be scored off of a sliding scale based off of candidate attendance. 75% attendance shall equal (1 point) and 95% and above attendance shall equal (5 points), each 5% increase in between 75% and 95% shall equal another (1 point) earned.
 - b) Department Trainings shall be scored off of a sliding scale based off of candidate attendance. 75% attendance shall equal (1 point) and 95% and up attendance shall equal (5 points), each 5% increase in between 75% and 95% shall equal another (1 point) earned.
 - 4. Peer Review (20 points maximum)
 - a) Peer review shall be scored off of a sliding scale. Each member of St. Augusta Fire Department shall have the opportunity to fill out a Candidate Peer Review Evaluation Form. The highest scoring candidate shall be awarded (20 points). Each subsequent candidate shall be awarded (4 points) less than the next highest scoring candidate. (i.e. highest score = 20 points, 2nd highest score = 16 points, 3rd highest score = 12 points, etc.)

- 5. Final Interview (50 points maximum)
 - a) Final Interview shall be scored off of answering questions chosen from the SAFD Promotional Question Bank and for prospective Lieutenants interviewing to properly fill out a St. Augusta Fire Department Scene Information Report, in regards to a given scenario.
 - b) Lieutenants Final Interview shall consist of two parts. The first part for each candidate shall consist of each candidate answering 10 questions worth up to a total (30 points maximum). Each question shall be worth up to (3 points maximum) each based off an Interview Rating Scale using defined Rating Definitions. The Interview Rating Scale Definitions shall be as follows: Good / Excellent Match = 3 points, Average Match = 2 points, Possible Match = 1 points, Unlikely / No Match = 0 points.
 The second part worth for each candidate shall be able to properly fill out a St.
 - The second part worth for each candidate shall be able to properly fill out a St Augusta Fire Department Scene Information Report, worth up to a total (20 points maximum), based off of a given scenario. Each section of the St. Augusta Fire Department Scene Information Report shall be broken down into 10 sections, each successfully completed section being worth up to (2 points maximum) per section.
 - c) Captains and Assistant Chief Final Interviews shall consist of each candidate answering 10 questions worth up to a total (50 points maximum). Fire Chief Job Description City of St. Augusta

GENERAL PURPOSE

Performs a variety of technical, administrative, and supervisory work in planning, organizing, directing and implementing fire prevention, suppression and to prevent or minimize the loss of life and property by fire.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED:

Works under the General Guidance and Direction of the City Administrator.

SUPERVISION EXCERCISED

Supervises all department staff, officers or volunteers.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITES

Plans, coordinates, supervises and evaluates fire operations.

Establishes policies and procedures for Fire in order to implement directives from the City Administrator, Mayor, or City Council.

Plans and implements Fire for the city in order to better carry out the policies and goals including those set forth in the City's Affirmative Action Plan; reviews Departmental performance and effectiveness; formulates programs or policies to alleviate deficiencies.

Supervises and coordinates the preparation and presentation of an annual budget for Fire Departments; directs the implementation of the Departments' budgets; plans for and reviews specifications for new or replaced equipment.

Responds to alarms and directs activities at the scene of emergencies.

Directs the operation of departmental training activities.

Controls the expenditure of departmental appropriations.

Handles grievances, maintains Departmental discipline and conduct and general behavior of assigned personnel. Also with Board of Review. Reviews call percentage.

Prepares and submits quarterly reports to the City Manager regarding the Departments' activities and prepares a variety of other reports as appropriate including the annual report of activities.

Plans departmental operation with respect to equipment, apparatus, and personnel; supervises the implementation of such plans.

Assigns personnel and equipment to such duties and uses as the service requires; evaluates the need for and recommends the purchase of new equipment and supplies.

Meets with elected or appointed officials, other Fire/EMS officials, community and business representatives and the public on all aspects of the Departments' activities.

PERIPHERAL DUTIES

Attends conferences and meetings to keep abreast of current trends in the field; represents the City Fire Departments in a variety of local, county, and state and other meetings.

Performs the duties of command personnel as needed and fulfills obligations.

DESIRES-MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education and Experience:

A) Seven years of experience in fire or emergency medical service workas a firefighter, three years of which must have been equivalent to fire lieutenantas a SAFD captain or higher, and

Completion of FFI, FFII, & First Responder.

- 1. Must have current Fire Instructor 1 certification.
- 2. Must possess, or able to obtain by time of promotion, a valid Minnesota Driver's License.
- 3. No felony convictions or disqualifying criminal histories within the past seven (7) years.
- 4. The ability to meet Fire Department physical standards.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. Proficient on Image Trend software as used by SAFD.
- 2. Have run training stations at SAFD training events at least 5 times in the past 36 months.
- 3. At least 20 previous incident commands at emergency scenes in the last three
- 4. Maintained minimum call percentage over the past 36 month period on SAFD,
- 5. Attendance at 90% of SAFD training and meeting events over the past 36 month period.
- 6. Maintain truck check attendance at a 90% level over the past 36 month period.
- 7. At least one year on a SAFD committee other than the Operations Committee.

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B)

Necessary Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

A) Thorough knowledge of modern fire suppression and prevention. Must also

have the knowledge of current procedures, techniques, and equipment; Working knowledge of first aid and resuscitation techniques and their application. Considerable knowledge of applicable laws, ordinances, departmental standard operating procedures and regulations.

B) Skill in the operation of the listed tools and equipment.

C) Ability to train and supervise subordinate personnel; Ability to perform work requiring good physical condition; Ability to communicate effectively orally and in writing; Ability to exercise sound judgment in evaluating situations and in making decisions; Ability to effectively give and receive verbal and written instructions; Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with other employees, supervisors and the public; and Ability to meet the special requirements listed below.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

A) Must be eighteen (18) years of age or older at time of hire;

- B) Must possess, or be able to obtain by time of hire, a valid state Driver's License:
- No felony convictions or disqualifying criminal histories within the past seven years;
- D) Ability to read and write the English language (or substitute any local or State requirements for those listed here) and;
- E) Ability to meet Departmental physical standards.

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT USED

Fire Apparatus, fire pumps, hoses, and other standard firefighting equipment, ladders, first aid equipment, radio, pager, personal computer, phone. (If position is strictly administrative, delete field equipment & tools)

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The physical demands described are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential function of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to sit; talk or hear; stand; walk; use hands to finger; handle; or operate objects; tools; or controls; and reach with hands are arm. The employee is occasionally required to climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl; and taste or smell.

The employee must frequently lift and/or move up to 10 pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to 100 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, and the ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIROMENT

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential function of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Work is performed primarily in office, vehicles, and outdoor settings, in all weather conditions, including temperature extremes, during day and night. Work is often performed in emergency and stressful situations. Individual is exposed to hearing alarms and hazards associated with fighting fires, including smoke, noxious odors, fumes, chemicals, liquid chemicals, solvents and oils.

Assistant Fire Chief Job Description City of St. Augusta

Assists in the preparation and presentation of an annual budget for the Fire Department; directs the implementation of the Departments' budgets; plans for and reviews specifications for new or replaced equipment.

Responds to alarms and directs activities at the scene of emergencies.

Directs the operation of departmental training activities.

Handles grievances, maintains departmental discipline and conduct and general behavior of assigned personnel. Also with Board of Review. Reviews call percentage.

Prepares and submits quarterly reports to the City Manager regarding the Departments' activities and prepares a variety of other reports as appropriate including the annual report of activities.

Plans departmental operation with respect to equipment, apparatus, and personnel; supervises the implementation of such plans.

Assigns personnel and equipment to such duties and uses as the service requires; evaluates the need for and recommends the purchase of new equipment and supplies.

Meets with elected or appointed officials, other Fire/EMS officials, community and business representatives and the public on all aspects of the Departments' activities.

PERIPHERAL DUTIES

Attends conferences and meetings to keep abreast of current trends in the field; represents the City Fire Departments in a variety of local, county, and state and other meetings.

Performs the duties of command personnel as needed and fulfills obligations.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education and Experience:

- A) Five years of experience as a firefighter, two years of which must have been as a fire captain or higher on SAFD, unless none of the existing SAFD captains have two years experience as a fire captain, in which case one year's experience may be acceptable, and
- 1. Must possess, or able to obtain by time of promotion, a valid Minnesota Driver's License.
- 2. No felony convictions or disqualifying criminal histories within the past seven (7) years.
- 3. The ability to meet Fire Department physical standards.
- 4. Must possess Fire Instructor 1 certification.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. Proficient on Image Trend software as used by SAFD.
- 2. Have run training stations at SAFD training events at least 5 times in the past 36 months.
- 3. At least 5 previous incident commands at emergency scenes in the last three years.
- 4. Maintained minimum call percentage over the past 36 month period on SAFD,
- 5. Attendance at 90% of SAFD training and meeting events over the past 36 month period.
- 6. Maintain truck check attendance at a 90% level over the past 36 month period.
- 7. At least one year on a SAFD committee other than the Operations Committee.

Necessary Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

A) Thorough knowledge of modern fire suppression and prevention. Must also

have the knowledge of current procedures, techniques, and equipment; Working knowledge of first aid and resuscitation techniques and their application. Considerable knowledge of applicable laws, ordinances, departmental standard operating procedures and regulations.

- C) Ability to train and supervise subordinate personnel; Ability to perform work requiring good physical condition; Ability to communicate effectively orally and in writing; Ability to exercise sound judgment in evaluating situations and in making decisions; Ability to effectively give and receive verbal and written instructions; Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with other employees, supervisors and the public; and Ability to meet the special requirements listed below.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED

Works under the supervision of the Fire Captain, Assistant Chief, and Fire Chief.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED

Supervises all fire fighters and subordinate personnel. May coordinate, instruct, or supervise training activities when assigned.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Performs and supervises fire fighting activities including driving fire apparatus, operating
 pumps and related equipment, laying hose, and performing fire suppression, containment,
 extinguishment, and salvage and overhaul duties.
- Performs and supervises emergency aid activities including administering first aid and providing other assistance as required.
- Participates in training drills, attends classes in fire fighting, emergency medical, hazardous materials, and related subjects. Instructs classes in assigned subject areas.
- 4. Operates radios and other communication equipment.
- Participates in inspections of hydrants, buildings as requested and other fire prevention related duties.
- Performs general maintenance work in the upkeep of fire facilities and equipment; makes minor repairs; washes, hangs, and dries hose; washes, cleans, polishes, maintains and tests apparatus and equipment.
- Assists in developing plans for special assignments such as emergency preparedness, training programs, fire fighting, hazardous materials, and emergency aid activities.
- Presents programs to the community on safety, medical, and fire prevention topics.
- Performs salvage operations such as throwing salvage covers, sweeping water, and removing debris.

PERIPHERAL DUTIES

- 1. Assists in departmental supervisory and administrative activities as assigned.

- Must obtain or be actively working to obtain fire instructor 1 certification within one year of promotion to lieutenant.

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Necessary knowledge, skills and abilities:

- 1. Knowledge of modern fire suppression and prevention and emergency medical services principles, procedures, techniques, and equipment; knowledge of first aid and resuscitation techniques and their application as demonstrated through First Responder certification; knowledge of applicable laws, ordinances, and departmental standard operating procedures and regulations.
- Skill in operating Fire Department equipment.
- Ability to train and supervise subordinate personnel; Ability to perform work requiring good physical condition; Ability to communicate effectively orally and in writing; Ability to exercise sound judgement in evaluating situations and in making decisions; Ability to effectively give and receive verbal and written instructions; Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with other employees, supervisors, and the public; and Ability to meet the special requirements listed

- The ability to meet Fire Department physical standards.

FIREFIGHTER JOB DESCRIPTION

POSITION PURPOSE

Firefighters have the responsibility of protecting life and property from the hazards of fire. This protection is offered by applying fire suppression methods to control and stop property damage, by saving lives through rescue from fire or other hazardous environments, and through public fire safety education to prevent fires. Firefighters respond to emergency calls to provide efficient and immediate care to the critically ill and injured. Firefighters assist in other types of emergencies and disasters that may occur in the community.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED

Works under the supervision of all Fire Department officers, specifically the Captain and Lieutenant.

PRINCIPLE RESPONSIBILITIES

Responds to fire alarms and other emergency calls, extinguishes or controls fires as a member of a team under the supervision of an officer.

TASKS

- 1. Selects, drags, lifts and carries hose and nozzle depending on type of fire, and correctly applies a stream of water or chemicals onto fire.
- 2. Positions and climbs ladders to gain access to upper levels of buildings or to assist individuals from burning structures.
- 3. Creates openings in buildings for ventilation or entrance, using ax, chisel, crow bar, power saw, or other equipment.
- 4. Protects property from water and smoke by use of positive pressure ventilation, waterproof salvage covers, smoke ejectors, and other equipment.
- 5. Administers first aid and CPR to injured persons.
- 6. Communicates with superior officers and other firefighters during emergency operations, may include use of portable two-way radios.
- 7. Wears appropriate protective clothing and equipment to include self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) depending on potential hazard exposure.

PRINCIPLE RESPONSIBILITIES

Maintains fire apparatus and equipment as part of a team under the supervision of an officer.

TASKS

- 1. Performs assigned duties in maintaining, equipment, buildings, grounds, and hydrants.
- 2. Conducts annual hose testing in accordance with NFPA 1962.

Conducts fire prevention classes, inspections and pre-fire planning as part of a team under the supervision of an officer, when the need arises.

TASKS

- 1. Meets with schools and community groups during fire prevention week or when otherwise requested to conduct fire prevention classes.
- 2. Conducts walk-through of buildings to give fire prevention tips.
- 3. Participates in pre-fire planning of target hazards in coverage area.

Attends regular and assigned training sessions to maintain and upgrade fire fighting, and first aid skills.

TASKS

1. Actively participates in drills, demonstrations and courses in hydraulics, pump operation and maintenance, and fire fighting techniques.

Performs as driver/operator of fire apparatus under supervision of an officer.

TASKS

- 1. Drives and operates fire fighting vehicles and equipment.
- 2. Maintains vehicles and equipment in a safe and operational condition according to the manufacturer's instructions.

Responds to emergency medical calls to provide efficient and immediate care to the critically ill and injured at the First Responder Level under the supervision of an officer.

TASKS

- 1. When patients need extrication from entrapment, the firefighter assesses the extent of injury and gives emergency care and protection to the entrapped patient and uses the prescribed techniques and tools for removing the patient safely.
- 2. Determines the nature and extent of illness and injury and establishes priority for required emergency care.

NATURE AND SCOPE: (relationships; knowledge, skills and abilities; problem solving and creativity; and freedom to act.)

RELATIONSHIPS: Must be able to work as a team member under stress caused by emergencies, danger, or criticism and must be able to work fast while concentrating very hard.

KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Mathematical Development (GED Level 2): Must be able to multiply, divide, use fractions and read graphs. Language Development (GED Level 3): Must be able to read fire-related textbooks, write reports with proper grammar and speak correctly in public. Knows English grammar and vocabulary of over 5,000 words; can understand and communicate using nontechnical written or spoken English. A high school diploma or equivalent is desirable. Post secondary or technical college courses in fire fighting are desirable.

PROBLEM SOLVING: Reasoning Development (GED Level 4): Must be able to interpret instructions and use logic to solve concrete problems.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: Vision; normal vision needed with or without correction. Requires both near and far acuity. Hearing; normal hearing is needed. To do this work the firefighter must discriminate among similar sounds in environments with a great deal of background noise. Lifting; the firefighter may be required to lift 100 pounds or more. Walking and/or mobility; must be able to walk or crawl while carrying or lifting. Must be able to ascend and descend stairs or ladders. Must be able to balance and have the ability to steady oneself and keep from falling. Must be capable of reaching (extend the hands or arms in any direction); handling (seizing, holding, grasping, turning, or otherwise working with hands), fingering (picking, pinching, or otherwise working with the fingers); and feeling (perceiving attributes of objects such as size, shape, temperature, or texture by means of receptors in skin, particularly those of the fingertips). Must be able to apply a leg lock with either leg upon a ground ladder to provide a safe anchor when operating hose lines or performing rescue work.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Must be at least (18) years of age or older at time of hire.
- 2. Must possess, or able to obtain by time of hire, a valid Minnesota Driver's License.
- 3. No felony convictions or disqualifying criminal histories within the past seven (7) years.
- 4. The ability to read and write the English language.
- 5. The ability to meet Fire Department physical standards.
- 6. Live within 15 minutes of St. Augusta Fire Department

WORK ENVIRONMENT: The firefighter works both inside where there may be protection from weather conditions and outside where there may be no effective protection from the weather. The firefighter may work in extreme cold where the temperature is low enough to cause marked bodily discomfort and variations in temperature which accompany extreme cold that may cause abrupt bodily reaction. They also may be required to work in extremes of heat where temperatures are high enough to cause bodily discomfort and variations in temperature which accompany extreme heat that may cause abrupt bodily reaction. The firefighter will encounter wet conditions and high humidity where atmospheric conditions have a moisture content high enough to cause bodily discomfort. The firefighter will frequently encounter noise and/or vibration exceeding 80 decibels, constant or intermittent, to cause distraction or possible hearing loss. The firefighter will also encounter a variety of physical hazards such as proximity to moving parts, electrical shock, working on high places, exposure to burns and radiant energy, exposure to explosive toxic chemicals and biologic agents.
